Anita Lorraine Fulford, 84, of Gosport passed away peacefully at home on Wednesday, August 27th, 2014.

She was born on February 22, 1930 in Sandborn, IN to Ray and Bonnie Greene. A true caregiver, Anita spent all of her life taking care of others. She graduated from the IU School of Nursing in 1952 and was a nurse for 37 years. This included 15 years as a special care nurse for premature infants in the Bloomington Hospital nursery from 1970-85. Anita loved the simple and beautiful things in life; living in the country, growing flowers, feeding birds, enjoying sunsets, seeing dogwoods in bloom, and playing a good hand of cards. During her retirement in Florida she was known for her shell collecting and intricate shell craft. She became known as the "Shell Lady" for her booth full of shell creations for sale at the Stinesville Festival each year.

Anita is survived by her son, Gary (Barbara) DeMoss; daughter-in-law, Teresa DeMoss; and brother, Edgar Greene. She has 6 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren. She is also survived by numerous nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Richard Ralph Fulford; son, Roger DeMoss; her parents and 3 brothers, George, Alfred, and Donald Greene.
