How Are the Mighty Fallen

When King David learned of the deaths of King Saul and his son Jonathan (David’s “best friend”), his cry was, “How are the mighty fallen!” (2 Samuel 1:19 – 27) Last Monday afternoon, a similar cry rose from the grieving hearts of Spiritual Israel when we learned of the death of HAROLD BENNETT.

Harold’s life was never one of luxury; it wouldn’t have suited him. His was not a life of formal education; it wouldn’t have suited him. However, when exemplifying humility and appreciation for “all things that pertain to life and godliness” (2 Pet. 1:3), Harold was comforted, and extremely well educated! In fact, when you consider the life of Harold Bennett, you find a life of many trials and tribulations; some being of such severity one wonders how he endured! His answer was, “God’ll get us through. We’re alright.” God always did and they were!

Harold had served the Lord’s church at Ellettsville, IN as an elder for several years. As is the life of most men whose God given gifts have enabled them to fulfill their desire of being elders (1 Tim. 3:1-7; Titus 1:6-9), Harold’s met with criticism (1 Tim. 5:17-20). Yet, he met with these critics, proved himself and in the estimation of those who truly investigated and knew him (Heb. 13:7; 17) he was worthy of “double honor.” His love for the Truth was contagious and how often I personally gained from asking his wisdom and guidance in spiritual matters.

When health caused his resignation from the eldership at Ellettsville, he shared with me his doctor’s orders. He truly did NOT wish to resign, but his health demanded such if he wished to continue life and providing for Bonnie. Even then, he continued working as he could with the obvious physical limitations. When Bonnie and he came to West Second, they immediately took their part in preparing communion, helping with others in need, taking part in worship services, etc. Harold’s influence and love remained strong and viral for the Lord – of those elements, his strength NEVER abated!!

And now, “how are the mighty fallen!” No one is “replaced” when

they die and their presence made void. Instead, such vacancies become necessary opportunities for others to increase their zeal, their work, and abilities for the Lord. It is a process of GROWTH, and a rather drastic dose of reality for those of us remaining: the mighty fall, and those who remain must now stand in the gap (Ezk. 22:30) as the work of our Lord continues till He come. Miss Harold? – Oh, indeed we will! But muse on this: If he taught us anything by his example, he taught us to “Trust in the Lord” (Prov. 3:5) and serve Him! I muse on how many observed and LEARNED that lesson from Harold Bennett!
