“ Kev and I, as well as Brian Featherston were hooked together on river fishing. We all fished together for over 18 years. At first we were content to lay up on the bank and hopefully wait to see if that big one would wonder up to our lines. As we grew older we needed to take it to the next level. I can remember Kev bartering for old boat motors as well as old boats. With his skill pertaining to small engines he would get these old pieces of crap, junk really, *RUNNING!!* How he ever did it I don't have a clue. I can remember like it was yesterday this old 1950's era Elgin 15 Hp out board motor he got. You had to see this thing, it belonged in a museum! It had the "Rap a rope" on the top of the motor. To start it you had to take about a yard and a half, piece of rope and rap it around the top pulley then jerk it till the rope fly's off. If it didn't start you had to go through the hole process again. Well Kevin thought he had all the bugs worked out as we hit the river. Each of us in our own boats. We launched from Freedom In. At the bridge. To go up the river, camp on a sandbar and run trout lines like we have done time and time again.

We were about 20 mins into our 45 min boat ride and staying in a single file line to stay in the channel so we don't tear up our props on the motors. We would glance back and forward to ensure we stood together. On this day I was in the middle with Brian being the lead and Kevin bringing up the rear. So far so good. I looked back and saw Kevin just pulling the crud out of that rope, rapping as fast as he could around for another pull to try and get his motor restarted. We had just got around a sweeping, shallow left corner, which the water was running fast through. It was near impossible to turn my boat and go back and help. I had to go forward to deeper water to swing around. Needless to say the fast water got Kevin. Pushing him into a log jam. I get turned around just in time to see his rope break in half on a pull. The motor had started! Than it stopped again. Kev was so mad he just jumped into the river and started walking up the river pulling his boat. Well within a minute or so he just stood in one place and was content to just keep his boat from washing away on him.

I got back to him and through him a rope to tie to his boat when he

said "I need to ride in your boat".. Why I asked? He said "When my motor died the current pushed me over a tree and ripped a hole in my boat"! He tied his boat to mine and jumped in. The first thing he said was that his motor was junk and he was going to through it in the river. This coming out of the same guy who had told me that his motor was going to put mine to shame. Kevin was always confident. We were good friends through the bad and good times. We just plain loved to fish together. I will miss you Kev! I will think of you in my prayers.

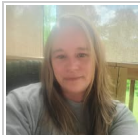

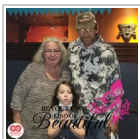

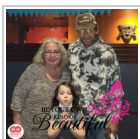
