Wil graduated from Bloomington High School North in 1987, where he was on the Computer Science Co-Op Program, and Vincennes University in 1992 with an AA in Archaeology. He also attended Indiana University Bloomington and Ivy Tech Bloomington majoring in Computer Science and Archaeology.

He was an Eagle Scout in Troop 100 of the Hoosier Trails Council of the Boy Scouts of America. For his qualifying community service project he designed and built a shelter house which was donated to Marlin Elementary School, it still stands in good stead today. Only one in a hundred boys who begin Scouting ever earns the distinguished honor and privilege to wear the Eagle Badge. He was a member of the Order of the Arrow. He was a camp counselor at Ramsburg BS Camp, he also attended the Philmont Scout Ranch in Cimarron, NM.

A music lover, he had a large collection on vinyl, CD's and tapes; he played several instruments. Wil was an avid gardener, everywhere he lived he could find a plot of ground to grow things. He also enjoyed archaeology, astronomy, cooking, camping and stamp collecting. He participated in the Hilly Hundred

and ran in marathons; he played on ice hockey teams. He had many pets through the years, his favorites were a pony born in his land and Sasha, his cat, who lived to be 22 years old.

He had been employed at Ear Wax and Sahara Mart in Bloomington; owned his own company "WIL HAUL" and worked at Cosco in CA, he has also worked as a caregiver. Wil helped start Rhinos, a club for teenagers in Bloomington.
